

ORDINANCE NO. 1995(10)

AN ORDINANCE OF HOPKINS COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AMENDING THE ORDINANCE AWARDED TO MADISONVILLE CABLEVISION COMPANY, A DIVISION OF AMERICAN TELEVISION AND COMMUNICATIONS CORPORATION, THE NON-EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO ERECT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE IN, UNDER, OVER, ALONG, ACROSS THE STREETS, LANES, AVENUES, SIDEWALKS, ALLEYS, BRIDGES, HIGHWAYS AND EASEMENTS DEDICATED FOR COMPATIBLE USES AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN HOPKINS COUNTY, OUTSIDE ANY CORPORATE CITY LIMITS, TOWER POLES, LINES, CABLES, WIRES AND OTHER APPARATUS FOR THE PURPOSE OF TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION BY CABLE TELEVISION SIGNALS TO ENABLE SALE OF ITS COMMUNITY TELEVISION ANTENNA SERVICE TO INHABITANTS OF SAID COUNTY, AND OTHER VARIOUS PURPOSES FOR A PERIOD OF SEVEN (7) YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SAID ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the governing body of Hopkins County, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court, has received a notification from Madisonville Cablevision Company, indicating that Section VII of Ordinance 1991(6), providing for the awarding of a cablevision franchise was in error in that it provided for a minimum of 330 MHz and 42 channels and that said ordinance should have reflected 300 MHz and 37 channels; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Court has determined that Ordinance 1991(6), which awarded to Madisonville Cablevision Company a non-exclusive franchise, should be amended to reflect said corrections.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of Hopkins County that Ordinance 1991(6), an ordinance awarding to Madisonville Cablevision Company a non-exclusive franchise, should be amended as follows:


SECTION VII - GENERAL SYSTEMS SPECIFICATIONS

The facilities used by Madisonville Cablevision Company shall have a minimum capacity of 300 MHz, 37 channels, and that 20 channels of entertainment and

information will be available on the effective date of this Ordinance. The facilities shall also be capable of distributing color television signals, and when the signals Madisonville Cablevision Company distributes are received in color, they shall be distributed in color where technically feasible.


Ordinance 1991(6) is amended or altered in no other respect. This Ordinance shall become effective on the date of passage.


