

ORDINANCE NO. 2005-3

AN ORDINANCE OF HOPKINS COUNTY, KENTUCKY, IN RE THE MATTER OF ACCEPTING A PORTION OF LAKE DRIVE EXTENDED FROM ITS PRESENT TERMINUS APPROXIMATELY SIX-TENTHS OF A MILE FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH NEW SALEM ROAD FOR A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 300 FEET, INTO THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court on a Petition filed by Nathan K. Richey, has expressed the desire to bring into the County Road System a portion of a public road named Lake Drive, which is described with more particularity as starting with its present terminus approximately six-tenths of a mile from its intersection with New Salem Road for a distance of approximately 300 feet, and whose width is thirty (30) feet.

WHEREAS, notice was published according to KRS 178.050 and notices were placed at three public places in the vicinity of said road.

WHEREAS, two viewers were appointed by the Fiscal Court together with the County Road Supervisor, who viewed the proposed road establishment and reported in writing to a public hearing held on February 17, 2005.

WHEREAS, their report stated that the advantages which will result to the individual and public are: "Will allow public and road department a place to turn around without using private driveway."

WHEREAS, the Hopkins County Fiscal Court finds that establishment of the subject road is in the public interest in the following respects: (1) Allow public and road department a place to turn around using a private driveway.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Fiscal Court of Hopkins County that the above-described portion of the public road named Lake Drive shall be brought into the Hopkins County Road System.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication.

First reading of this Ordinance was held on February 17, 2005.

Upon motion of Magistrate Welch and seconded by Magistrate Duncan, the Ordinance was approved for its first reading on February 17, 2005. Whereupon the vote was called, and on roll call, the vote stood:


